



March 31 Joseph, Patriarch

Joseph was the son of the patriarch Jacob and Rachel. The favorite son of his father, he incurred the jealousy of his older brothers, who sold him into slavery in Egypt and told their father he was dead (Genesis 37). In Egypt he became the chief servant in the home of Potiphar, a military official. Because Joseph refused to commit adultery with his master's wife, he was unjustly accused of attempted rape and thrown into jail (Genesis 39). Years later, he interpreted dreams for Pharaoh, who then freed him from prison and placed him in charge of the entire country. When his brothers came from Canaan to Egypt in search of food, they did not recognize him. He eventually revealed his identity to them, forgave them, and invited both them and his father to live in Egypt. He is especially remembered and honored for his moral uprightness (Genesis 39) and for his willingness to forgive his brothers (Genesis 45 and 50).

The words were written by English Anglican minister's daughter, religious poet and hymn-writer, Frances Ridley Havergal (1836 -1879), and the hymn was first published, with 11 verses, in a 1874 appendix to Songs of Grace and Glory (Charles B. Snepp). More-recent publications usually leave out some of the verses.



Where did those names come from?

Maundy Thursday - March 28, 2024

According to John's gospel, Jesus washed the disciples' feet at the last supper, and the name for this day may come from the Latin word *mundo* which means "wash." However, most scholars think the name comes from the Latin *mandatum* (like the English word *mandate*) referring to John 13:34 where Jesus gave the disciples a new commandment, to love one another.

Good Friday - March 29, 2024

This may seem a rather odd name for the day on which Jesus died. It is probably a contraction of "God's Friday" in a similar way that the wood *goodbye* is a contraction of "God be with ye."

Easter - March 31, 2024

The general assumption is that Easter comes from the old English *Eastre* who was a pagan goddess of spring, symbolized by a rabbit; hence the Easter bunny. Some scholars, however, believe that the word comes from the German *eostarun* meaning "dawn," recalling the time of day that the women went to the tomb and the fact that Jesus' resurrection bring a new dawn.

In Eastern churches - Ukrainian,
Russian, Greek Orthodox, and others Easter is referred to as *Pascha*, coming
from the Hebrew word for "Passover"
because the first Easter occurred at the
time of and in the content of the
celebration of Passover. Many people see
parallels between Passover and Easter,
both being times of God's amazing and
miraculous intervention in human history.

Calendar Notes - A Moveable Feast

Ever wonder why the date of Easter changes from Year to year? There is a logic to it, and it goes back to ancient times.

Unlike Christmas, which always falls on a certain date (December 25), Easter by its very nature always falls on a Sunday. And, because the events of Jesus' death and resurrection occurred in the context of the Jewish Passover festival (remember, Jesus and the disciples were Jewish), the date is chosen in conjunction with the lunar calendar, because the Jewish calendar is lunar. So, Easter Sunday is always the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after March 21 - the vernal equinox. Thus, Easter can fall anywhere in between March 22 and April 26. This year, Easter is March 31.
